**4.1.** "\_\_\_\_\_" in Hebrew sounds like what Eve said, "I have created" or "I have acquired" a man.

Luther's view was that Eve thought Cain was the \_\_\_\_\_. English translations show Eve saying she created/acquired a man with the help of Yahweh.

**4.2.** Abel must have kept flocks for \_\_\_\_\_\_ clothing, or both, since people did not eat animals yet.

Cain was farming \_\_\_\_\_\_, which was a legitimate occupation in God's view.

**4.3-5.** Why one sacrifice was \_\_\_\_\_\_ and the other was not is never explained in the Old Testament. One theory is that Abel brought the best of what he had, while Cain did not.
